A Message from Master McGee

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to our second newsletter via email. It's hard to believe that our school building has been closed for seven weeks now as a result of the national emergency. However our school at home has been open thanks to your brilliant work at home and the hard work of my staff. And of course we are missing our boys and have taken great joy from their photographs and videos. Please don't worry if you can't get to do everything and if you can't do it all. We know you are doing your best and I can assure you that we are planning ahead to make sure that we will get your son up to speed when he gets back. I feel fortunate to lead the school of such a great school community and such great children. They are a credit to you all. My staff and I miss seeing them as they make our school such a happy place!

Before I came to Monastery NS I was an ICT Advisor for 9 years working with all the secondary and primary schools in the north-east. I also delivered an inservice course each summer to teachers based upon Cloud computing. I joked with last year's participants that Google Classroom and Seesaw were that good that nobody would have to go into school at all! Little did I know that this would indeed be the case and that I would be rapidly setting up school at home and virtual classrooms in the Cloud!

School has continued in the Cloud with regular staff planning meetings taking place by video conference and collaborative documents and resources being worked on. Staff login every morning and check the staff whiteboard to see what's happening in our school today. We are in constant communication throughout the day and this continues well after school has closed for the day. School at Home Survey

Sixty per cent of our parents responded to our survey. Thank you so much to all of you who gave up your precious time to complete our school at home survey. It provided us with a picture of your own circumstances and your school at home needs going forward. Also thank you so much for your overwhelming support of our efforts. It is greatly appreciated by our staff. Here are some of the key results of the survey from those who responded;

- Remote Support by email? 96.2% of our parents are satisfied or very satisfied.
- Internet Access 18.5% have very fast fibre / 36.9% have fast and reliable / 37.7% Ok and reliable most of the time / 6.2% slow and unreliable / 0.8% no access.
- Satisfied with son's knowledge of online safety? 68.5% Yes / 21.5% unsure / 10% No
- Son has his own IT device? 57.7% Yes / 14.6% sometimes / 27.7% No
- Is the device shared? 36.9% Yes / 14.6% Sometimes / 48.5% No
- Kind of device? Computer 1.5% / Laptop 13.1% / Tablet/iPad 54.6% / Smartphone 12.3% / Other 18.5%
- Printer at home? 54.6% Yes / 45.4% No
- Dedicated school at home space? 82.3% Yes / 8.5% Sometimes / 9.2% No.
- Going forward would you support learning via Seesaw and Google Classroom? 73.1% Yes / 23.8% Unsure / 3.1% No.
- Have you set up son's email and receive support? 94.6% Yes / 5.4% No
- Have you set up parent contact email with us? 79.2% Yes / 20.8% No
- Visit school website / Youtube Channel? 32.3% Regularly / 60% Occasionally / 7.7% Never
- How would you rate our website / Youtube Channel? 33.1% Excellent / 40.8% Very Good / 24.6% Good / 1.5% Poor.
- Downloaded TextaParent App? 75.4% Yes / 24.6% No.
- Preferred social media? 46.9% Facebook / 24.4% Instagram / 13.1% Snapchat / 3.8% Twitter / 86.2% WhatsApp / 16.2% Youtube / 1.5% Email
- Do you need to collect books? 43.1% Yes / 56.9% No.

Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) - MNS Seesaw & MNS Google Classroom

We have been supporting your son's school at home with email so far. However he is working remotely and he doesn't have live direct contact with his teacher. With our new VLEs MNS Seesaw (Infants to 3rd) and MNS Google Classroom (4th to 6th) your son is brought closer into a virtual classroom with live contact with his teacher and friends. He can post work, photographs, videos and projects to his teacher. This is totally private and is not seen by other pupils. His teacher can share an excellent piece of work with other pupils but also monitors and controls all online pupil traffic.

We rolled out MNS Seesaw this week and the participation is phenomenal. Teachers are able to post work for the children to do. They can respond by drawing, video, recording their voice. This is particularly useful for the younger children. Remember if the children attend Support Teachers (SETs) they need a profile in Seesaw for both teachers. MNS Google Classroom is rolled out to 6th and will be rolled out to 5th on Tuesday and 4th on Wednesday. This is a superior form of support delivered from G Suite for Education. When set up and teachers and pupils are familiar with it teachers will be able to deliver live PowerPoint presentations to pupils and video conference with pupils via Google Hangouts Meet.

Please note that email support of your son will cease on Monday May 11th and all pupils will only work in their nominated VLE. Teachers will now post work each morning and not every week. Your son will need to get into a routine of logging in each morning, if possible for parents. If you haven't set your son up yet on the class VLE email his teacher as soon as possible. Teacher will then require written email consent from you to include your son on the VLE. He/she will then email you MNS Seesaw or MNS Google Classroom setup details.

We are continuing to monitor Department of Health guidelines and will inform you at a later date around procedures for the collection of Book Rental Titles. In the meantime, please monitor your son's use of these books and remind him that they will be used by his younger school mates again next September and therefore need to be in the best condition possible.

I know they are greatly disappointed that they are not getting the chance to do the other challenges. Master McAdam and Master McGee are thinking a lot about this at the moment and will come back to you with our plans at a future date. When restrictions lift or ease we will try to work out how we can do the challenges and still keep Covid-19 precautions in place.
